

Introduction



The Cultural Infrastructure Index published by AEA Consulting is now in its eighth edition.¹ The Index seeks to measure investment in capital projects in the cultural sector globally, identifying projects with a budget of US\$10 million or more that were publicly announced or completed within a calendar year. Our definition of "cultural infrastructure" comprises museums and galleries, performing arts centers, multifunction arts venues, cultural hubs and districts, and – for the first time this year – immersive arts venues. Projects tracked include new buildings, renovations, expansions, and adaptive reuses.

This year is one of relative stabilization following a post-pandemic building peak, largely due to delayed

announcements. In 2023, 192 major cultural infrastructure projects were completed globally and 198 were announced. Completed projects totaled US\$8.6 billion of investment, while announced projects represent \$5.6 billion of new spending. While the value and volume of completed projects increased by 10% and 4% respectively on the previous year, announced projects appear more modest. Notwithstanding some notable exceptions, the scope, scale, and cost of announced projects are falling, probably as a result of the impact from economic uncertainty affecting both public and private sector investment, including the overhang of increased inflation and construction costs. Taking a long-term view, we continue to see signs of growth in cultural infrastructure globally: completed and announced projects have increased by 10% and 6% respectively each year (2016-23 CAGR - Compound Annual Growth Rate). In summary, our analysis of global cultural infrastructure development finds that:

- 192 major capital infrastructure projects were completed in 2023, accounting for over \$8.6 billion of investment. This represents an increase in both the volume and value of completed projects when compared to 2022, in which we recorded 185 projects valued at \$7.8 billion. Looking at the long-term trend, the volume of completed infrastructure projects has increased at an average rate of 10% annually (2016-23 CAGR), while the nominal value of investment remains equal to 2016, representing a reduction in real terms.
- The number of projects announced fell from a record high of 225 in 2022, down 12% to 198. The value of announced projects fell by almost a quarter (23%) to \$5.6 billion, with the median budget size down from \$30 million to \$25 million. In the long-term, the volume of announced projects is increasing at an average rate of 6% annually (2016-23 CAGR) while the total value of investment is decreasing by 6% annually as average budgets decrease.
- Museums and galleries remained the most prevalent building type for the eighth consecutive year, accounting for 213 announced and completed projects (55% of total) valued at \$7.1 billion. The next most popular typologies were performing arts centers (72, 19% total); multifunction arts venues (66, 17% total); and cultural districts (22, 6% total). This year we have added immersive arts venues as a new category, identifying 17 announced and completed projects across North America, Europe, Asia, and the Middle East.
- Looking across all categories, the scale of projects both announced and completed has dropped by almost a third (31%) from 4.7 million to 3.2 million square meters. The median budget size also dropped from \$30 million to \$26 million while relative cost per square meter has increased by 34% from \$6,422 in 2022 to \$8,612 in 2023. This is more pronounced among certain infrastructure classes for example, the cost per square meter for museums and galleries reached \$8,970, up almost 50% on the previous year (\$6,097).

- North America continues to have the lion's share of investment in major projects. In 2023, 176 projects were completed or announced worth a total estimated \$7.2 billion. In Europe, 103 projects were completed or announced, representing \$3.8 billion investment, while in Asia, 71 projects were valued at \$2.2 billion. Together, these regions account for 93% of annual investment and their pace of development is trending upwards - most rapidly in Asia (14% 2016-23 CAGR). 14 projects were completed or announced in both the Australia/New Zealand region and the Middle East, accounting for \$870 million investment; however, this excludes large swaths of investment in the so-called "gigaprojects" across the Gulf region, the value of which largely remains confidential. Six projects were completed or announced in both Latin America and Africa, accounting for \$177 million, only 1% of total investment. Globally, cultural infrastructure development shows signs of sustained growth in all territories, averaging 10% increase in projects annually since 2016.
- While the majority of investment can be traced to a handful of countries - the US, UK, and China account for \$9.2 billion investment (65% total) there is significant growth of investment within

- other markets, often driven by public investment in large civic buildings of national importance, such as the Museum of Polish History in Warsaw (\$276 million) or the *Cité Internationale de la Langue Française* in Villers-Cotterêts, France (\$225 million). We also find that the development of major cultural infrastructure outside of traditional cultural capitals in the Global North is rising. In total, projects were recorded in 48 countries and over 275 towns and cities, only 27% of which are among the top 75 global urban centers.²
- As seen consistently since we started tracking in 2016, most projects can be classified as led by public (44%) or not-for-profit (37%) entities, representing \$13.3 billion of total investment across both completed and announced projects. The number of commercial projects has continued to grow year-on-year, accounting for 7% of total projects in 2023 (\$541 million). Other private and public/private initiatives remain only a small minority (3% total).
- Despite a 10% fall from last year, the largest share of completed projects continued to be

new builds (93 projects, 48% total). Renovation and adaptive reuse were also popular project categories and show signs of sustained growth, together comprising 78 completed projects (41% total). Expansions were least common; only 21 were completed (11% total).

- The most frequently seen architectural practice in this year's Index was Snøhetta, engaged on five projects globally, including collaborations with h2o architectes and BNIM. Beyer Blinder Belle and Purcell were also in high demand, engaged on four projects each. Since 2016, the most frequently engaged practices have been Kengo Kuma and Associates (18 projects), Herzog & de Meuron (14 projects), and David Chipperfield Architects (13 projects),
- The top three highest value projects completed in 2023 were the Perelman Performing Arts Center in New York (\$500 million); the American Museum of Natural History, also in New York (\$465 million); and the Beijing Performing Arts Center (\$352 million). The top three announced projects were the Tennessee Performing Arts Center in

Nashville (\$500 million); the Sejong Center for the Performing Arts in Seoul (\$242 million); and the Grieg Quarter in Bergen (\$191 million).

The data that underpins the Index is gathered daily throughout the year by AEA staff who comb through numerous publications in English, Spanish, Italian, Arabic, and Chinese, including aggregator sites and news forums. The Index only captures projects that are formally announced as either planned or completed. Almost all completed projects are formally announced, but that is not always the case for *planned* projects. For example, we are aware of numerous cultural infrastructure projects in the Arabian Gulf that are in the advanced stages of planning but will not be captured in the Index until they are completed. While we cannot claim that the Index is exhaustive, it is intended to provide an accurate picture of trends in global cultural infrastructure investment and offer practical information on the number, type, location, and budgets of major projects announced and completed every year. After eight years, we have a high degree of confidence in the picture that we draw.

Sustainability in Cultural Infrastructure Development: The Case for Adaptive Reuse

For the last three years, AEA Consulting has been tracking completed and announced adaptive reuse projects, allowing us to monitor global trends in repurposing built infrastructure for cultural uses. In 2023, 16% (or 63) of all tracked projects were adaptive reuse projects, with a median capital project budget of \$23 million. 44% of these adaptive reuse capital projects were museums and galleries, 25% were multifunction arts venues, 14% immersive venues, and 16% were either performing arts centers or cultural districts. The adaptive reuse projects tracked cover a broad range of industrial and civic heritage transformations: mills and factories, breweries, and warehouses, as well as post offices, churches, prisons and courthouses. The locations of these projects are equally diverse, showing a growing interest in preservation and repurposing of built infrastructure for cultural uses globally. Adaptive reuse projects can generate unique value across social, cultural, and economic dimensions, including:

- Revitalization and activation of vacant, abandoned, and derelict buildings, infusing new life into neighborhoods by enlivening the built environment and the surrounding areas
- Preservation of the historical fabric of places while reimagining their core functions
- Utilization of craft and conservation skills, and the preservation and proliferation of those skills
- Creation of opportunities for community participation and engagement, fostering a sense of ownership and connection to the reimagined places
- Reduction of costs, as repurposing existing buildings can be more cost-effective than new construction provided that - a heavy qualification - the existing structure does not require vast improvements or changes.



Perhaps most importantly, as we need spaces to be developed to continue advancing our societal and cultural ambitions, the vital question is how to achieve the positive and long-term impacts while minimizing the greater environmental damage. We are becoming more aware of the long-term negative environmental impacts that building projects often produce. The construction sector accounted for around 37% of energy and process-related CO2 emissions in 2023, making it a major contributor to global greenhouse gas emissions.¹

When environmental sustainability takes center stage, adaptive reuse and retrofitting of existing buildings is often seen as the most sustainable way forward. While adaptive reuse projects often require a significant investment of skills, time, and money, they present a more environmentally sustainable model than newly built facilities.

Recently announced adaptive reuse projects that will accommodate arts and cultural uses include projects as diverse as the planned transformation of the Darlinghurst Law Courts in Australia to become a multi-disciplinary arts center; a former postal office being turned into a fashion museum in Bath, UK; the 18th century public hospital building, Real Albergo dei Poveri, being transformed into a cultural hub to accommodate an archeological museum and other cultural, social, and educational uses in Naples, Italy; and a conversion of a former newspaper office block into the LGBTQ+ World History Museum in Palm Springs, California. The Fred Rouse Center for Arts and Community Healing in Fort Worth, Texas, currently in the design stage, is housed in a former warehouse that was occupied in the 1920s by one of the largest chapters of the Ku Klux Klan. Led by a coalition of local civic and arts groups, the future cultural center will focus on social justice initiatives and provide spaces for performances, exhibitions, workshops, community meetings, a resource center for LGBTQ+ youth, and an artist residency. In this instance, the reuse is envisaged as reparative.

Cultural hubs and districts, multipurpose cultural venues, and museums are all among the adaptive

reuse projects completed in 2023. In Istanbul, Baruthane Cultural Center is housed in a former 324-year-old industrial facility. Once a gunpowder factory, the 4,800-square-meter cultural center now houses a library, a series of event spaces, coworking and study spaces, an auditorium, a gallery, a restaurant, and green public courtyard. Fotografiska opened two new galleries - one in a repurposed 1909 department store building in Berlin and another in a repurposed riverfront warehouse in Shanghai. In Marrakech, the 1922 state bank building has been converted into the Jamaa El Fna Intangible Heritage Museum. In Czech Republic, Automatic Mills, a former flower mill in Pardubice, Eastern Bohemia, was turned into a multi-purpose cultural center, housing art galleries, an education center, restaurants, and a rooftop observation deck. In California, Chapman University opened the new three-level Sandi Simon Center for Dance in a converted 1918 packing house, thus preserving the historical building that now accommodates study spaces, classrooms, meeting areas and a multifunctional mezzanine space.

Powerhouse Arts in Gowanus, Brooklyn, NYC, is a leading example of an industrial heritage building turned into a cultural facility. Opened in 2023 and now fully operational, Powerhouse Arts provides workspace for art and fabrication professionals and educators and presents a public program in partnership with local community organizations. AEA Consulting had the privilege of working with Powerhouse Arts in the early stages of the operational planning and in mapping out its future uses and governance model.

Powerhouse Arts²

When completing the redevelopment of the Powerhouse in Brooklyn, the intention was to embrace the building's varied history – first as a power station and later as a haven for local artists seeking refuge, creative freedom, and radical possibility. The design program celebrates the architectural details that point to these chapters of the building's history. The architects Herzog & de Meuron were clear in their decision to allow the patina to remain a part of the building's transformed identity, ready to take on the next century's traces of use.

The program and the vision for the facility came about in tandem. The site of the former Brooklyn Rapid Transit Power Station inspired the establishment of an arts organization that would reinvigorate the building in the name of art. As the site was secured and remediation efforts – extensive prerequisite efforts to bring the site to a state of environmental readiness before it could be redeveloped – were underway, Powerhouse Arts the organization was founded and piloted its program in satellite shops across Brooklyn, informed by numerous community round tables and R&D efforts to identify and articulate the core needs of NYC's artistic community.

The industrial heritage building presented some challenges: the derelict state of the existing structure of Turbine Hall required extensive efforts to

The project demanded thorough and meticulous tests, including load tests of the existing concrete slab and the remaining masonry, before it could be determined fit for adaptation. It was also decided that the Boiler House would be rebuilt and reintegrated in the footprint of the original structure to house additional fabrication activities.

The Powerhouse Arts facility is one of the few sites that remain zoned for industrial use in Gowanus neighborhood in Brooklyn and that still operates as a hub for arts fabrication and creative production. The building's industrial character is authentic to the activities that take place within its walls, nodding both to its history as a critical piece of Brooklyn infrastructure and as the art factory that it is today.

The facility was developed with a keen focus on the health of contemporary artists working within the space. For example, meticulous care was taken to research off-gassing of materials, to address the production of dust and other airborne materials, and to supply the building with a constant flow of clean air. State-of-the-art HVAC systems were installed, infrastructure set in place, and avenues for clean disposal of waste implemented.

Powerhouse Arts' community sees themselves as stewards of the building and of the artistic community, and the processes taking place within the building nod to that mindset.

The adaptive reuse projects that bring new cultural uses to heritage buildings share some common principles and practices, many of them rooted in environmental objectives:

- Sustainability: adaptive reuse promotes sustainability by reducing waste, conserving embodied energy, and minimizing the need for new construction materials and resources
- Preservation & Compatibility: any changes or additions to the heritage building should aim to preserve the original fabric and character as much as possible. The new use should be compatible with the existing spatial configuration, structural system, and heritage values of the building
- Accessibility: the adapted building should meet contemporary accessibility standards and building codes, while respecting the heritage fabric and character
- Community Partnership: involving local communities and partners across civic and cultural sectors, the adaptive reuse process fosters a sense of ownership and appreciation for the heritage building
- Economic Viability: the arts and cultural use should be economically viable and financially sustainable, ensuring the long-term preservation and maintenance of the building
- Compliance: the new building should strike a balance between preserving built heritage and

meeting contemporary functional and regulatory requirements.


Many of the newly built facilities are designed to reach high standards of sustainable construction and maintenance by using sustainable materials, techniques, and high-quality fit-out, allowing for resource preservation and recycling. But many others, despite improved industry regulations, still fall behind the best practice in "green" architecture and construction. Martin Müller's April 2024 article in The Art Newspaper on museum expansions reinforces the point: "Building your way to sustainability is a bad idea, no matter how green your new building is... Art institutions need to face up to the fact that they are caught up in a growth logic that is bad for the planet. Even if this growth logic is not of their own making, art institutions have a responsibility to help change it."³

The ambition needs to be a joint one. Governments and policymakers can play a key role in supporting the adaptive reuse of physical infrastructure into arts and cultural facilities through targeted policies, funding, and guidance, while architects and operators in the cultural sector can make the practice of adaptive reuse and retrofitting more commonplace, innovative and, ultimately, sustainable for generations ahead.


Total project numbers


Total capital investment



Regional distribution


Mix of projects by building type






Total capital Investment (US\$ in millions)


